Reflect for a moment on these words – “I am a sinner, but I trust in the infinite mercy and patience of our Lord Jesus Christ, and I accept in a spirit of penance.”

This was the response given by now Pope Francis to the cardinals when asked to accept his election as pontiff. He accepted his position in a spirit of penance. What message was he delivering to the cardinals? It would appear that he was not only humbled by his selection, but wanted all to understand that although Pope, he is still human, and he seeks to be reconciled with God and his fellow man when the separation brought on by sin does and will occur.

How might marriages be different if the spouses to be were to respond in the same way as Pope Francis? “I am a sinner, but I trust in the infinite mercy and patience of Jesus Christ to bless our marriage, and I accept your offer to be your lawful wedded spouse until death do us part, in a spirit of penance.” Perhaps the words “in good times and in bad” are suppose to lead us to write permanently on our hearts - a spirit of penance.

And so... how do we respond to God’s call to live a life of humility in a spirit of penance?

It is interesting to note that Pope Francis often recalls the story of St. Matthew’s call by Jesus to become one of his followers. As you know, Matthew was a tax collector for the Roman Empire, and was paid quite well for his services. However, he was shunned by the Jews and was indeed an outsider in his community. To say it another way, he had very few friends. Jesus saw beyond all of this, Matthew’s sin, his greed and his loneliness. Jesus saw Matthew’s need for love and belonging. Jesus responded with mercy and love. Jesus forgave Matthew for his short-sighted focus on wealth and guided him to a much more fulfilling mission.

How is Jesus calling you to a spirit of penance? Have you been completely healed? Have you truly embraced a new life in Christ? What is holding you back?

Take a moment this week to gaze upon the Eucharist. Ask Jesus to heal any potential short-sightedness. Ask Him to help you reach deeply into your heart to see the dignity of all. And if necessary, whether desirable or not, take the important step of attending the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Ask God for complete forgiveness and a lasting spirit, like Pope Francis, a spirit of penance.
