The Grand Knight reported as follows:

Pork distribution and cooking report by Brother Rob McBurney

- About 30 butts pork butts (\$30 each) were sold along with another 30 pints of pulled pork (\$12 each)
 - Current price for pork is \$1.37 / lb.
 - We may be netting just under 1K
- Rob will be cooking all day on Saturday (2/3) on the grass area behind the school kitchen
 - \circ $\,$ Help will be needed with cooking from 10:30 AM to Noon as Rob has other commitments at this time.
 - More help will be needed from 4:30 PM on, as the pork is packaged and shredded.
- Help will be needed distributing the pork after the 8:15 and 10:30 Masses on Sunday, February 4th

The Knights are responsible for the soup during the soup supper on March 23rd after the Stations of the Cross and Mass.

Parish picnic on March 18th:

• The Knights have been asked to help serve and provide a donation of \$300 - \$500.

- Per the Financial Secretary, we have been getting a lot of requests lately for donations.
 - Our answer has to be: "It's not in our budget, but we will consider it for next year."
 - Maybe we can offer some assistance, but perhaps not as much as we have been asked for.
- All ministries in the Parish are being asked to contribute in some way.
- The point was raised that if the Knights are being asked to contribute this much, perhaps a Knight should be on the organizing committee
 - The people organizing the picnic will be having a meeting February 7th at 2 PM, probably in the Corly conference room.
 - Our response at this meeting should be that we are interested in participating, but we need to discuss what we can do.
 - We are not flush with cash at the moment
 - We need to obtain a written request listing what is expected of us.
