May 2025 Lecture for the Knights of Columbus Chapter 12554 The Mystery of the Kingdom of God (part 1) excerpts from The Now Word November 29, 2024 by Mark Mallet

Let's begin tonight's lecture by placing ourselves in the presence of God ... In the name of the Father, ... As we begin, let us recall that God is always outside of time. It's more than saying He always was, is now, and will be for ever! It is that God IS ALWAYS PRESENT TO ALL THE PAST, THE PRESENT, AND THE FUTURE. HE SEES ALL ... AND ACTS THROUGH ALL for the good of man who is the end result of His "seven days" of creation. God created the universe and all in it just for man so that He could divinize man and share the eternal beatitude with him. Why did God create Adam and Eve knowing that they would disobey? Only God really knows, but some theologians have speculated that He did so, so that He could send His son to redeem man and in doing so divinize man and share eternity with him in the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God with man "living in the Divine Will," just like Adam before his "fall."

AND now Mark Mallet who begins by asking, "What is the Kingdom of God like? To what can I compare it? It is like a mustard seed that a man took and planted in the garden. When it was fully grown, it became a large bush and the birds of the sky dwelt in its branches. Mark 4:30-32 EVERY day, we pray the words: "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven." Jesus would not have taught us to pray as such unless we were to expect the Kingdom yet to come. At the same time, the first words of Our Lord in His ministry were: This is the time of fulfillment, The Kingdom of God is at hand; Repent, and believe in the gospel. (Mark 1:15)

"But then He speaks of future 'end time' signs, saying: ... when you see these things happening, know that the Kingdom of God is near. (Luke 21:30-31).

"So, which is it? Is the Kingdom here or yet to come? It is both. A seed does not

explode into maturity overnight. The earth produces of itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. (Mark 4:28)

"More specifically we read from Isaiah 65:17-25 about 'The Glorious New Creation,' an insight into eschatology of the end times: (Isaiah 65:17-25)

"For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth; and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. But be glad and rejoice for ever in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem a rejoicing, and her people a joy.

"I will rejoice in and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of and the cry of distress. No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the child shall die a hundred years old, and the sinner a hundred years old shall be accursed.

"They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. They shall not build and another they shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. They shall not labor in vain, or bear children for calamity; for they shall be the offspring of the blessed of the Lord, and their children with them.

"Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear. The wolf and the lamb shall feed together, the lion shall eat straw like the ox; and dust shall be the serpent's food. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain, says the Lord."

Now my thinking is that, if we just think about this, each of us has been created or born to live in our society on earth during these turbulent times of our own passion week, go through our own Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday ('3 days of darkness') arriving at Easter Sunday to enter into the fulfilment of the Kingdom of God in the coming Era of Peace, which scripture says will last for a "thousand years."

The Reign of the Divine Will

"Returning to the Our Father, Jesus is teaching us to pray essentially for the 'Kingdom of the Divine Will,' when in us, it will be done "on earth as it is Heaven." Clearly, Jesus is speaking of a coming manifestation of the Kingdom of God in the temporal 'on earth' - otherwise, He would simply have taught us to pray: 'Thy Kingdom come' to bring time and history to its conclusion. Indeed, the Early Church Fathers, based on the testimony of St. John himself, spoke of a future Kingdom on earth.

"We do confess that a kingdom is promised to us upon the earth, although before heaven, only in another state of existence; inasmuch as it will be after the resurrection for a thousand years in the divinely-built city of Jerusalem... Tertullian (155–240 A.D.) ... To understand what the symbolic words a "thousand years" means, see The Day of the Lord. The essential point here is that St. John wrote and spoke of the fulfillment of the Our Father: A man among us named John, one of Christ's Apostles, received and foretold that the followers of Christ would dwell in Jerusalem for a thousand years, and that afterwards the universal and, in short, everlasting resurrection and judgment would take place. St. Justin Martyr

"Unfortunately, early Jewish converts presumed a literal coming of Christ on earth to establish a political kingdom of sorts, replete with banquets and carnal festivities. This was quickly condemned as the heresy of millenarianism. Rather, Jesus and St. John are referring to an internal reality within the Church herself: The Church 'is the Reign of Christ already present in mystery.' Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 763 But it is a reign that, like the blossoming mustard seed, is not yet fully mature: The Catholic Church, which is the kingdom of Christ on earth, [is] destined to be spread among all men and all nations... —POPE PIUS XI ... So what will it look like when the Kingdom comes "on earth as it is in Heaven"? What will this mature "mustard seed" look like?

The Era of Peace and Holiness

"It will be when, through the power of the Holy Spirit, the Bride of Christ is restored to the original state of harmony with the Divine Will that Adam once enjoyed in Eden. This is our great hope and our invocation, 'Your Kingdom come!' - a Kingdom of peace, justice and serenity, which will re-establish the original harmony of creation. In a word, it will be when the Church resembles her spouse, Jesus Christ, who in the hypostatic union of His divine and human nature, restored or 'resurrected,' as it were, the union of the Divine and human will through the reparation and redemptive act of His suffering, death, and resurrection. Hence, the work of Redemption will only be complete when the work of Sanctification is accomplished:

"For the mysteries of Jesus are not yet completely perfected and fulfilled. They are complete, indeed, in the person of Jesus, but not in us, who are his members, nor in the Church, which is his mystical body. ... And what exactly is it that is 'incomplete' in the Body of Christ? It is the fulfillment of the Our Father in us as it is in Christ.

"All creation,' said St. Paul, "groans and labors up till now," awaiting Christ's redemptive efforts to restore the proper relationship between God and his creation. But Christ's redemptive act did not of itself restore all things, it simply made the work of redemption possible, it began our redemption. Just as all men share in the disobedience of Adam, so all men must share in the obedience of Christ to the Father's will. Redemption will be complete only when all men share his obedience (and thus live in the Divine Will) ...

What will the Kingdom of God look like? This lecture is continued in May ...

To live in My Will is to reign in it and with it, while to do My Will is to be submitted to My orders. The first state is to possess; the second is to receive dispositions and execute commands. To live in My Will is to make My Will one's own, as one's own property, and for them to administer it as they intend; to do My Will is to regard the Will of God as My Will, and not [also] as one's own property that they are able to administer as they intend. To live in My Will is to live with one single Will [...] And since My Will is all holy, all pure and all peaceful, and because it is one single Will that reigns [in the soul]. no contrasts exist [between us]... On the other hand, to do My Will is to live with two wills in such a way that, when I give orders to follow My Will, the soul feels the weight of its own will which causes contrasts. And even though the soul faithfully carries out My Will's orders, it feels the weight of its rebellious human nature, of its passions and inclinations. How many saints, although they may have reached the heights of perfection, felt their own will waging war on them, keeping them oppressed? Whence many were forced to cry out: "Who will free me from this body of death?", that is, "from this will of mine, that wants to give death to the good I want to do?" (cf. Rom 7:24) —Jesus to Luisa, The Gift of Living in the Divine Will in the Writings of Luisa Piccarreta, 4.1.2.1.4, (Kindle Locations 1722-1738)

That "perfection" will be expressed most perfectly, one could say, when we "live in the Divine Will" as Heaven intends for the Bride of Christ before the end of time.

This will be the basis, the substance, the beautiful characteristic of the Kingdom of My Divine Fiat: one the Will, one the love, one the happiness, one the glory between Creator and creature. —Jesus to Servant of God Luisa Piccarreta, August 17, 1927, Vol. 22
