New business was taken up and disposed as follows:

• Robb suggests that we sponsor Christmas ornaments related to the new dome painting. He passed around information and examples of ornaments created by a particular company and is suggesting a particular design. Since there seems to be interest in this among parishioners, he is suggesting ordering 300 at a cost of \$11 apiece. They take 5 weeks to make so we would take advanced orders. We intend to sell them for \$25 apiece, for a profit of \$14 apiece. Robb believes we can sell enough to cover our costs and make a profit. If all sell, we could realize a profit of \$3,500-\$4,000. Robb made a motion that we spend up to \$3,500 for the costs and fees. He is thinking we might be able to support Columbus Hope again (this will be a future motion.) The Womens' Society previously had a Christmas ornament sale but we don't have data on how many they were able to sell. During discussion it was pointed out that \$3,500 is a large part of our available funds and thus there is a risk. It was suggested that we offer a pre-sale for a one week period and use the results to decide whether to actually do the fundraiser. The minimum order is 250 so we don't have much flexibility. The motion was amended to include a pre-sale period and decision as to whether to



proceed with the order based on whether we are likely to sell enough to cover our costs. The amended motion was voted on and passed.

- Robbie Wiggs moved that we transfer our savings account (low interest) to the main checking account for the purpose of making our annual \$1,500 donation to the parish. During discussion it was pointed out that we only had the savings account for some liquid funds which we have not had to touch. The motion was voted on and approved.
- An envelope will be available at the front desk until Tuesday for anyone interested in donating to Scott Liddle (funds to be given to directly to priests on his India trip.)

Lecture Reflection:

We voted to accept Scott's presentation as our Lecturer's reflection for this meeting.
