### Saint of the Month (March) Deacon Charles P. Poole, Jr.

**Saint Katharine Drexel** (1858 – 1955AD); Foundress, Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament; Patroness of philanthropists and racial justice.



Katharine was born in Philadelphia on November 26, 1858, and died on March 3, 1955, at the age of 96. The second child of Francis Anthony Drexel

and Hannah Langstroth, she was raised in a millionaire's home. Her mother died five weeks after her birth. The Drexel family was both powerful and wealthy. Her stepmother Emma opened their home to the poor three days a week, and spent her life sharing her wealth with worthy people. Katharine later did the same with her inheritance. Her father brought the family to daily Mass, and they meditated together half an hour every day. She became a wealthy orphan at the age of 25 inheriting one-third of the estate worth millions of dollars.

She became sympathetic to the plight of the Native Americans, and visited a reservation in the Dakotas. There she met the great Chief Red Cloud and saw the extreme poverty of Native Americans. Next she visited Pope Leo X111 in Rome and pleaded with

him to send more missionaries to the Indians. He encouraged her to become a mis-Her spiritual director, sionary herself. Bishop James O'Connor, suggested that she found a new congregation of nuns for this apostolate, so she and thirteen others obtained their formation as nuns at a convent of the Sisters of Mercy. After they pronounced their final vows as Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament Katherine transformed her family summer house at Torresdale, PA into a convent, and then opened boarding schools for Black and Native Americans, the first being St. Catherine Indian School in Santa Fe, New Mexico (1887) for Pueblo Indian children

She spent her life using her inheritance and her energy ministering to the poor. The main priority of her congregation was founding and staffing schools for Black and Native Americans throughout the United States. She established 145 missions and 62 schools. She even founded what eventually became Xavier University in New Orleans. In 1935, she had a heart attack which disabled her, so she spent the remaining 20 years of her life in prayerful retirement. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on November 20, 1980, and canonized on October 1, 2000, as the second American-born saint.

### **Operation Hope**


