

Bishop and Doctor of the Church

Patron Saint of Writers

He was born in the Duchy of Savoy into a family of minor nobility four years after the closing of the Council of Trent. He was

eldest in a family of many children, almost all of whom died at birth or in early infancy. His father instilled military virtues on the family, and was disappointed when his son chose the priesthood.

Francis was educated by private tutors and in private schools, then by the Jesuits at the College of Claremont, and at the University of Paris where he excelled.

While there he had a deep spiritual crisis over the issue of predestination, and received little consolation from the Jesuits and Dominicans who were fighting over the interpretation of Aquinas and Augustine instead of contending with the Calvinists over predestination. He wrote "Whatever happens, Lord, may I at least love you in this life if I cannot love you in eternity since no one may praise you in hell." He eventually earned a doctorate in law from the University of Padua.

Through influential contacts, Francis was appointed by the pope as provost of Geneva, with a rank just below that of a bishop, so he had to be rushed through the minor orders and then ordained a priest to fill this post. He then spent the next four years in a diocese that had been taken over by the Calvinists.

As the number of converts increased, his mission changed to that of finding priests and establishing parishes. There was an emphasis on the newly instituted Forty Hours Devotion.

In 1602 he became bishop of an unreformed pre-Tridentine diocese and was assigned the additional task of reforming lax monasteries. A major emphasis in the Church at that time was implementing the reforms of the Council of Trent, a policy called the Counter-Reformation. It encountered great resistance.. Francis also helped to calm the debate between the Jesuits and the Dominicans which ended in a compromise with both sides told to desist.

Francis wrote "Introduction to the Devote Life", the first series of spiritual exercises designed for lay people. It was considered too lax at the time of writing, but now has the reputation of being too rigorous. Times have changed! He also wrote "The Treatise on the Love of God" for the order of the Visitation Nuns, which he founded in collaboration with his friend St. Jeanne de Chantal. In 1923 he was named patron saint of writers.

Connecting Faith to Everyday Life

The test of any form of spirituality is connecting the good ideals with everyday life. A man must begin to form a vision and a lifestyle in keeping with his commitment to Christ.

Instead of keeping separate compartments, he begins to make connections — first in his mind, then in his choices.

He begins to ask new questions:

- 1. How does God view this issue?
- 2. What is the Lord's plan for me?
- 3. How does my job fit into God's larger purposes for me and for the world?
- 4. How does God view my marriage, my children, my style of parenting?
- 5. What's is God's view of sexuality?

6. What does Christ teach about human relations and dealing with difficult people?

Instead of relying on his own judgments and insights, the man seeks guidance through prayer, reading the Bible and other spiritual sources, and seeking the counsel of other faith-filled people. As he grows in vision, he also comes to see that his actions and choices need to be brought into line.

Here is where the going can get tough, because he may reach the conclusion that he has to make some changes in his lifestyle if he is going to be faithful to the newfound vision.

As one man told me, "Spirituality was fun till I realized it meant giving God the right to ask some things of me!"

Let's be very clear about this. Spirituality is not meant to be fun and games. It is discipline, and it is tough.

This is the reason that in A Man and His God I stressed the importance of the traditional spiritual disciplines, especially prayer and Bible reading. Then I tried to make connections between spirituality and some of the key areas of a man's life: self-image, work and leisure, the quest for love, marriage and family, dealing with life's problems.
